Scholarships Overview

Duke of Kent School nurtures and celebrates the talents and gifts of our pupils. Our School is a purposeful environment where students embrace all of the opportunities before them and specialise in areas where they are particularly adept.

We have a small but broad Scholarship programme which supports this ethos through the recognition of exceptional ability in the fields of Academia, Computer Science, Music, Performing Arts, Art and Sport as well as that of All-Rounders who excel across a range of disciplines.

All of our students are united by a love of learning and a heartfelt passion for their subject. Our dedicated teachers nurture this enthusiasm and inspire pupils to reach greater heights. By the time they reach the end of their time at the School, our young people will be enriched by the confidence,

qualifications and knowledge to succeed in the next stage of their educational journey.

Scholarships are awarded to pupils who are entering Year 7 from the current Year 6 Duke of Kent School cohort and also to pupils applying externally.

Scholarship holders are subject to a comprehensive annual review by the Head and the relevant Head of Department and, if the required standards are maintained, will last the duration of the pupil's enrolment at Duke of Kent School.

Each scholarship signifies excellence in the area to which it relates and should be a source of great pride to the holder. Each scholarship is essentially an honorary award but does carry a small financial reward.

Scholarship Assessment Day

Scholarship Assessments take place at Duke of Kent School. Candidates are seen by subject specialists and are interviewed by the Head. Academic Scholarship Assessment generally takes place the first Saturday in November following the Candidate General Assessment Morning. Candidates will sit extension papers in English and Maths. All other scholarship assessments take place the following week.

Academic Scholarship

Who should apply?

Academic Scholarships are offered to pupils of outstanding academic distinction, based on the results of the Scholarship Assessment Day. Academic Scholars are expected to take a positive and constructive lead in the academic life at Duke of Kent School, through their thirst for knowledge, intellectual curiosity and diligent approach to their studies. Academic Scholarships are offered to those who demonstrate distinguished academic attainment alongside a conscientious work ethic.

Process for selection

Following the Assessment Morning, candidates will sit an extension paper in English and Maths. There will also be an interview with the Head of Duke of Kent School, Mrs Sue Knox and the Director of Teaching and Learning, Mr Alex Seeley.

All Rounder Scholarship

Who should apply?

All Rounder Scholarships are awarded to candidates who perform well in the additional extension papers in Maths and English and have considerable talent in other areas. As well as sitting a written examination, candidates are expected to have reached a high standard in at least two of the following categories:



Computer Science



Performing Arts

Sport Sport

The categories will be assessed according to the criteria for individual scholarships, as outlined in the following pages, and are awarded at the Head's discretion. Candidates must demonstrate academic talents and personal qualities necessary to make a significant and ongoing contribution to Duke of Kent School and scholarships will occasionally be awarded for particular ability and potential in a field other than those listed above.

Process for selection

Following the Assessment Morning, candidates will sit an extension paper in English and Maths. There will also be an interview with the Head of Duke of Kent School. Mrs Sue Knox.

Art Scholarships

Who should apply?

The Art Scholarship is open to candidates who are able to demonstrate technical mastery, contextual understanding and broad subject knowledge. They should also demonstrate a passion for the visual arts and a desire to explore new media and ways of working.

The scholarship programme is designed to encourage the pursuit of excellence among our young artists. To this end, our growing group of Art Scholars and identified Stretch and Challenge pupils are regularly exposed to more advanced visual arts techniques, are encouraged to get involved in competitions and extra-curricular projects, and are taken on trips to galleries, events and artists' studios, that will broaden their existing knowledge of the subject.

Process for selection

Candidates will attend a half day workshop during which they will explore a variety of media, processes and ways of working. Over the workshop they will be encouraged to discuss their work, demonstrating their passion, understanding and openness to the world of Art and Design.

Should candidates have a portfolio of work, they are welcome to bring this with them to the workshop day, however this is not a requirement for attaining a scholarship. They should be prepared to discuss their favourite artists and movements, speak about exhibitions they have visited, and explain some of the thought processes behind their portfolio of work.

Computer Science Scholarships

Who should apply?

Computer Science Scholarships are awarded to candidates who are passionate about how computers operate, have an excellent programming ability and showcase a keen interest in the technology industry. Candidates should also acquire a sense of creativity, logical thinking skills and a desire to help out in the department. Candidates will be expected to take part in coding competitions and take Computer Science at GCSE.

Process for selection

Candidates will undertake a 30-minute programming task that tests their knowledge of programming concepts and will assess candidates on how they apply these skills to a particular scenario.

Secondly, during a 10-15 minute interview, candidates will talk through their completed program with the Head of Department, Mr Andrew Boden. This will be an informal interview giving the candidates an opportunity to explain what they have programmed. Finally, the candidates are invited to bring in as much evidence to support their application as they wish. Generally, this consists of several projects from school with anything that they do independently, out of school, of a practical or technical nature (hobbies/interests) can really help.

Candidates will need to bring the following for their assessment:

Music Scholarships

Who should apply?

Music Scholarships are awarded to candidates who are passionate about music, perform to high standards and demonstrate a high level of commitment to the Music Department. Candidates are expected to sing in one of the many School choirs and, where appropriate, play in the Orchestra or Big Band. Candidates will also help with the organisation of concerts and mentor, support and encourage younger musicians within the School.

Process for selection

Candidates should be able to demonstrate musical ability of at least Grade 3 standard and should be working towards Grade 4-5 standard on their first instrument. Grade examinations do not have to have been taken.

Candidates will be asked to:

- Play two contrasting pieces on their first instrument. If a second instrument is offered, an additional single piece should be played. Voice is considered an instrument
- Pieces can be unaccompanied or with accompaniment (backing track is fine and if piano accompaniment is needed, this can be provided)
- Pieces should be between approximately I and 3 minutes long
- Candidates should write a paragraph or two about themselves, their musical background and what they love about music and why

There will also be an interview with the Director of Music, Mr Nick Rye giving candidates an opportunity to talk about their love of music and aspirations in the department whilst at Duke of Kent School and beyond.

Candidates will need to bring the following for their assessment:



Musical instruments



Music/Sheet Music



Backing track (if required)

Performing Arts Scholarships


Who should apply?


Performing Art Scholarships are awarded to pro-active young people who excel in an area of the Performing Arts.

Candidates should have passion and enthusiasm for performing arts, imagination and creativity and will be expected to take roles in School productions, either front or back stage and also mentor, support and encourage younger performers.

Process for selection

Candidates will be asked to:






- The candidates should use voice and movement to portray the role which is in keeping with the context of the piece
- Candidates must also be able to reflect upon the performances they have given, including why they chose the monologue and how they created their role
- Pieces will then be redirected by our Head of Drama, Mrs Sam Honey, to explore how candidates take direction
- Finally, candidates will be asked to improvise with a given prop to show they can be spontaneous and react in the moment

There will also be an interview with the Head of Performing Arts, Mr Nick Rye, giving candidates an opportunity to talk about their love of Performing Arts and aspirations in the department whilst at Duke of Kent School and beyond.

Candidates will need to bring the following for their assessment:



Any backing tracks needed

Any personal props or costumes

Sports Scholarships

Who should apply?

Sports Scholarships are awarded on the basis of sporting excellence and promise. Candidates should be performing at a high level of performance in at least two sports and demonstrate a very good level of fitness. Candidates should have a committed and dedicated approach to sport, health and exercise.

Process for selection

Candidates will be required to perform sports based assessments, which will provide information regarding their speed, agility and cardiovascular fitness level. They will then perform skills and techniques linked to a number of sports.

Where possible the candidates will be asked to play in smallsided matches to demonstrate their ability in competitive situations, their leadership qualities and their capacity to work within a team.

There will also be an interview with the Director of Sport, Mr Graham Herbert and Head of Girls' Games, Miss Josie Vickers.

Candidates will need to bring the following kit for their assessment:



PE Kit – tracksuit, shorts / skirt, polo shirt, long football / hockey socks, swimming trunks / costume and a towel.
